




#### **Juror's Statement**

Besides competent handling of the media, I look for variety, originality, whimsy and mostly risk. I look for things that make us feel, wonder, hunt, or time travel, even if that feeling is uneasy. It is not the job of art to merely decorate or replicate our world. I want to sense the presence of the humanity of the artist and delight in what he or she wanted us to notice.

Some pieces that were eliminated had composition issues. Everything should look like you planned it to fit comfortably and that we are compelled to stay within the image.

The award winners are the most subjective. My favorites tend to be ones that stood out from the group as having a unique presence, and took artistic risk with the imagery or the handling of the material.

In the third prize winner, "Face," by Robbins, the framing demands you take that image seriously. The mat width separates us from the wall and other images, and we are drawn into this worried soul. The job of an artist can be to create a new reality, one that we accept on its terms and this little jewel does just that. It isn't drawn right, but it's just right. Is it male or female? Does it matter? I'm glad the title leaves that open. The way it is drawn shares the struggle of our perception of humanity and emotions. It takes a lot of nerve to share that.

The second prize was awarded because it was not the same complementary color schemes we see in so many landscapes. The glints of aluminum are unexpected but not gimmicky looking.

My first place selection was because it is not of this world, it had the whimsy factor. This image takes me away.

#### Juror's Statement

I have attempted not to look at the work of other artist exclusively through my own aesthetic lens, but to understand the message each artist is trying to convey and judge how well he or she has done that. Jurying an exhibition with over 100 entries and a wide range of media and styles of expression was an enormous challenge.

The quality and variety of work submitted indicates a vibrant community of artists and an organization of which the City of Fredericksburg can truly be proud.

My approach was to do a "walk through" and observe the pieces which at first glance "spoke" to me. I then repeated the process several times, based on originality, craftsmanship, strength of composition and presentation. My final selections had the most powerful imagery while at the same time adhering to the "Texture and Pattern"

I reviewed the slideshow produced by the FCCA staff and made tentative selections. Once the show was hung and I could see them in a gallery setting, I was able to make my final selections.

First-prize winner "Hypnotic Hypotenuse," by Maria Shell, is a remarkably conceived and executed piece which contains wonderful surprises in color and line within a rigid pattern.

I love the rhythmic flow of second-place "More Than Just the Sum" by Christine Hager-Braun. Though seemingly delicate and fragile, its warm color nuances united by the circular elements make a strong composition.

Third-place winner "Platter and Bowls," by Denise Downard Hennig, shows exceptional craftsmanship and attention to details. The pattern in the glaze and choice of color make this grouping special.

## November National Exhibit, Focus on Color Juror: Jerry Shapiro

As founder and current director of Red Door Gallery in Richmond, Virginia, Jerry Shapiro has curated art from many artists throughout the United States and has been personally collecting art for many years. He has selected works from hundreds of artists to show in over 50 solo and group shows. His worldwide experience as a collector has given him both an historic and a contemporary perspective. With a preference for large scale works with a strong visual impact, Jerry finds an artist's use of color adds its own dimension and power to a piece. Jerry reviews the work of hundreds of artists each week through shows, exhibitions and publications. He is very passionate about all forms of art and never tires of seeing new work.

HE JURYING PROCESS When entering juried shows,
the artist must realize that it is
a highly competitive and unpredictable
contest. It is, after all, one juror's
opinion on a given day, after sorting
through a myriad of entries in various
media, and making difficult decisions.
Jurors are chosen for the expertise
they bring to the task of selecting

art for shows. As professionals, they are discriminating and sophisticated. Jurors want to see not simply good technique, but the hand of the artist in a work that is creative and original. Some jurors refer to the "wow" factor -- that intuitive reaction that makes them stop in their tracks and take a second look. Thus, each exhibit is a reflection of a particular juror's esthetic judgment. Jurying at FCCA is usually on a Tuesday when the gallery is closed to the public. The juror is given a tour of the Frederick Gallery to evaluate the space available and the style of installation. The juror is informed of the total number of works that can be accommodated, considering the sizes of entries and number of three-dimensional works.

Selection of work for regional exhibits takes place in the upstairs classroom where all actual works are displayed for the juror. Works by the same artist are grouped together. The curator and assistant curator are present only to assist

workshops, art bus trips, and other activities.

the juror in moving work and retiring declined work to the storage room. After an initial look at all work, the juror begins the blind selection process during which the artists' names are not provided. Although the prizewinners may be decided after this process, most jurors return to view the installed exhibit before selecting awards. Later, jurors also have access to a web-link slideshow of all selected work and can review the final selections before preparing a Juror's Statement and making award decisions. Selection of work for national exhibits is a similar process except that it also includes a Powerpoint slideshow of all CD entries and a slideshow of 35mm entries, identifying each work with a number, the media, size and title. I hope this helps artists understand how the jurying process actually works. The jurors make independent decisions based solely on the works submitted. We at FCCA are deeply grateful to the artists whose entries make our national and regional shows memorable, and look forward to receiving future submissions from you. Submission fees help to maintain our historic "Silversmith House" (c. 1785) and support our exhibitions.




