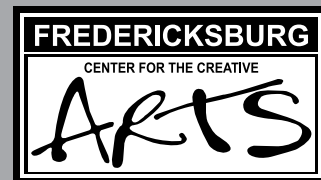

### JUROR'S STATEMENT

I'd like to thank the FCCA and Carrol Morgan for the chance to work with them. Since I was a first-time juror, I was excited with this opportunity!

The selection process was very difficult. The submitted works represented an incredible variety. I aimed to include a range of works that represented that diversity, emphasizing work that uses color and texture in creative and unsuspected ways.

Honorable Mentions: Lee Cochrane's photo “Upside Down Town I,” resembles an abstract painting. Being printed on canvas adds an unexpected layer of texture. Michael Habina's “My Immortality Tree” suggests nostalgia, reflection, and even loss. The hand painted tree adds a personal touch. “Sunset Sail,” by Karen Julihn, brings to mind Impressionism, playing with colors to capture an ocean sunset's fading light. Susan Skrzycki's “Apparition” combines encaustic, oil, and photography in a multi-dimensional piece.

Third place: Susan Krieg's “Marsh Grass Reflections” takes a water-reflection photograph and adds a layer of ambiguity: where does the water end and the grass begin? The photograph's composition calls to mind manmade minimalistic paintings, though the subject clearly belongs to nature.

Second place: Barbara Taylor Hall's “Glimpses II.” The geometric composition is paired with layered, flowing color. The seemingly solid black lines suggest something hidden beneath them; the work provides a glimpse through a window into another dimension.

## MARCH JUROR'S STATEMENT, *continued*

The selected work spoke to the theme, *See the Light*, and was strong, original work that I knew I would remember and want to view repeatedly. I looked at how the various media were handled and with what confidence. I am attracted to work that makes me see the artist's way and gives me a glimpse of the artist's inspiration. In addition to selecting unique and well executed work, I was drawn to pieces that were enhanced by framing or presentation.

Many of the submissions succeeded in capturing gorgeous light in an interesting way. In both "Empty Jars" and "Morning Light," Tom Smagala uses highlights, shadows and reflected light beautifully. Light has energy in Michael Habina's "The Memory Sparkles" and Carolyn Beever's "Distorted View." I couldn't resist the whimsical glow of Cathy Herndon's "Moroccan Box: The Speed Ticket." Several artists created light by the interaction

of glowing color such as Aina Nergaard-Nammack in "#1277Guggenheim Interior," and Kenneth Lecky in "Raw Sugar." The color and subject of Bro Halff's "Colorful East Shore, Kaua'i" seem to reflect light and warmth. Susan Krieg's "Illuminating the Ordinary" and Kerri Williams's "Contradiction" emphasize the duality of light and dark. These pieces and more let me see light in a unique way.

Though the majority of submissions for *See the Light* were from talented artists from Virginia and Mid Atlantic states, many other parts of the country are represented including Alaska, Wisconsin, Ohio, Indiana, and California.

My hope is that I have selected an exhibit that allows people to lose themselves in the light and go away with favorite pieces to remember and revisit.



## PRESIDENT'S LETTER



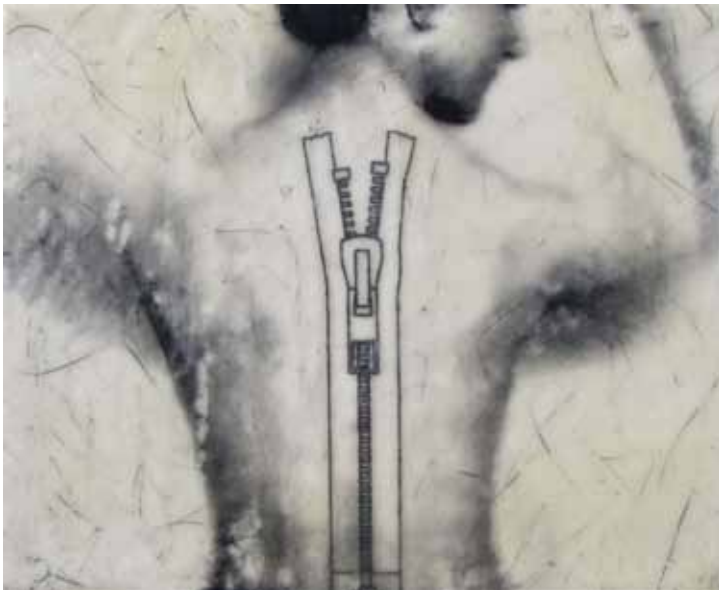

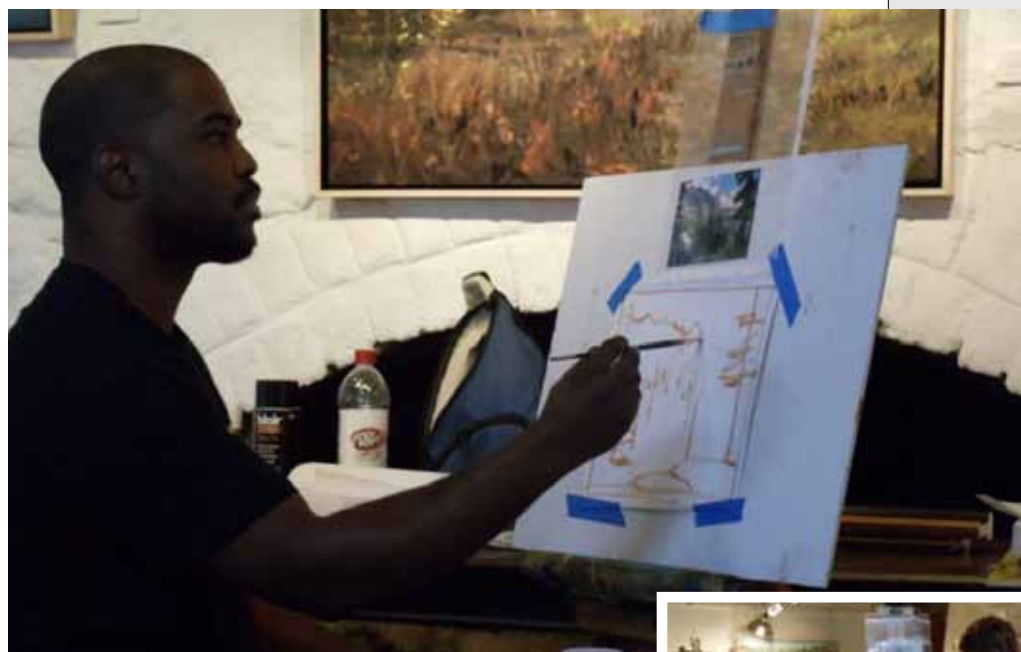

artists are paying attention to the presentation of their work and are reaping the benefit of acceptance into exhibits.

I appreciate the many artists who financially support the FCCA with their entries and offer my thanks for their participation in the active arts community showcased at the Fredericksburg Center for the Creative Arts.

Painter / printmaker Linda Rose Larochelle is a graduate of the San Francisco Art Institute and a lifelong art educator. She has done graduate work at the University of Maryland and at VCU. Recently retired from the Arlington County Virginia Public Schools she is now devoting full time to painting and printmaking.

Her relief block prints reflect a fascination with color, texture and pattern. The strong contrasts and multiple textures in her prints lend a folk like charm to the human figure.

Most of the work in this show reflects an interest in mother and child images, a common theme in Larochelle's work.

Linda says, "The image of mother and child shows up in my work a lot. I feel it lends itself to the simplified

and expressive quality of the medium and reminds me of an important time in my life." Explaining the relief printing process she adds: "I spend a lot of time drawing my images then transfer them to the linoleum block. They are carved out with hand tools. The ink is rolled on with small rollers and each block is printed by hand rubbing or run through a small press. The number of prints of each image is usually small. Many of my prints are unique each one being a little different because of variations in color."

Also included in this Mother's Day Show are some of the artist's whimsical watercolors. The viewer should find them a happy balance to the block prints and their emphasis on patterns and textures are a carryover from the prints.

Linda Rose Larochelle is represented by the Loft Gallery in Occoquan as well as Stifle and Capra in Falls Church and is a member of Falls Church Arts.
