Marc Chagall was a multi-dimensional artist who produced paintings, drawings, stained-glass windows, prints, ceramics, and tapestries. His images were dream-like, almost surrealistic, of his childhood village in Belarus, religious figures, and life.

Frederick Gallery themed exhibitions allow for a broad

approach to submitting artworks representing a particular subject or idea. The theme should encourage artists to present a variety of media and techniques of choice. Consider a theme and represent it in a direction that will surprise, delight and engage the viewer.

Juried exhibition online submissions and hand-delivered submissions are accepted up to 4 pm on the deadline date. If you experience problems, please contact the curator immediately by phone/text at 540-760-6928. Follow instructions precisely for online submissions and remember to rename your jpg images with artist last name and title EX: Smith-John_Portrait of John so the curator can save the image(s) alphabetically by the artist's last name. Use standard capitalization and check for accuracy of spelling and artwork dimensions (height x width) EX: 9x12 with 9 as the height, to ensure artwork is presented in the correct orientation.

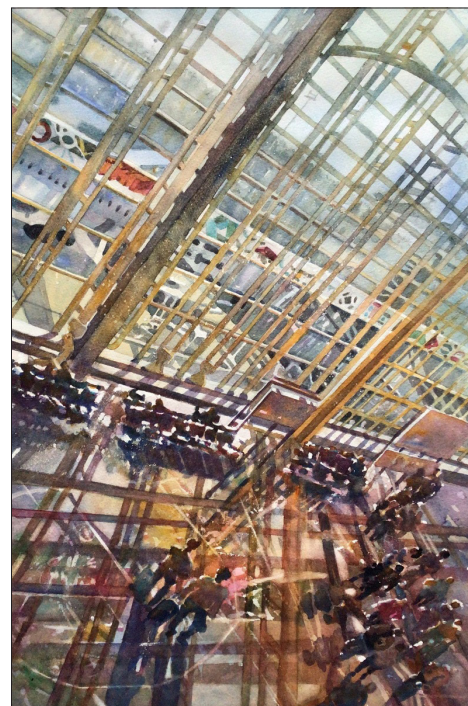

Juror: Ward Saunders

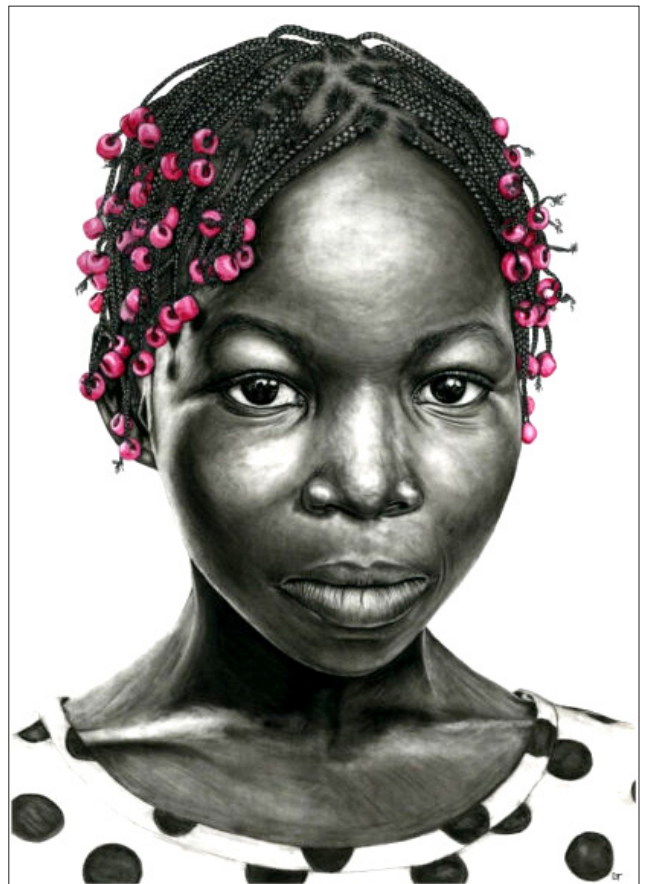

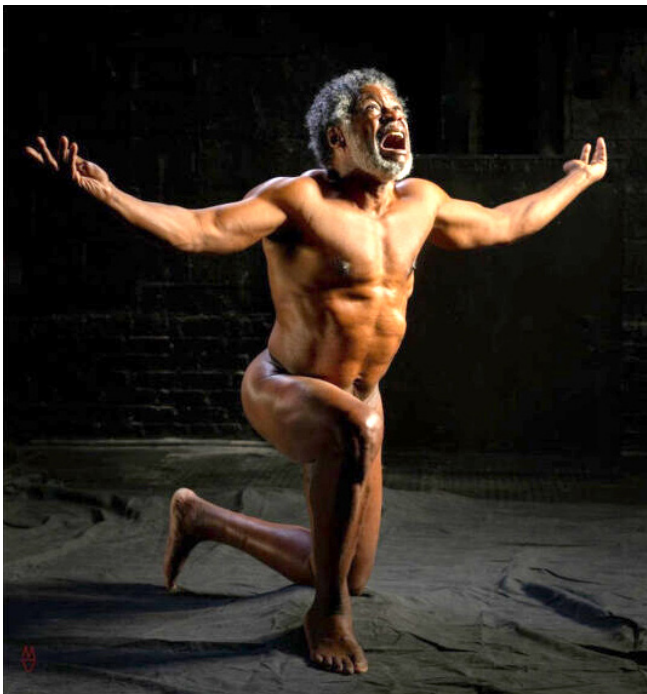

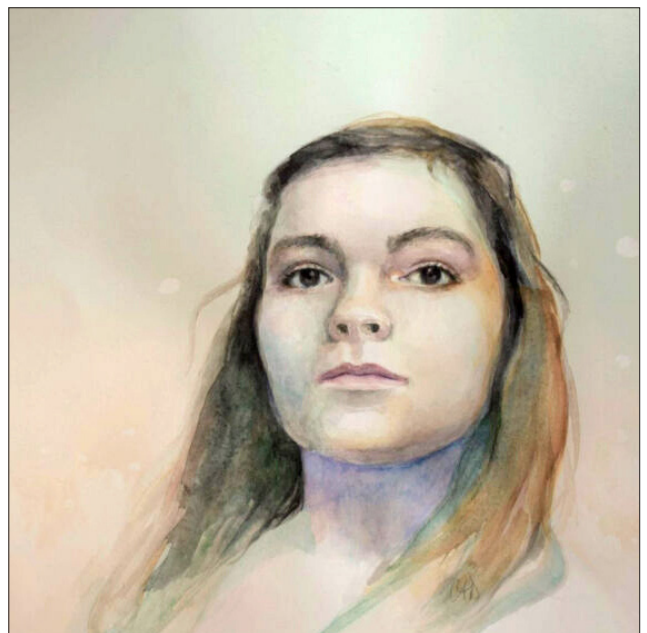

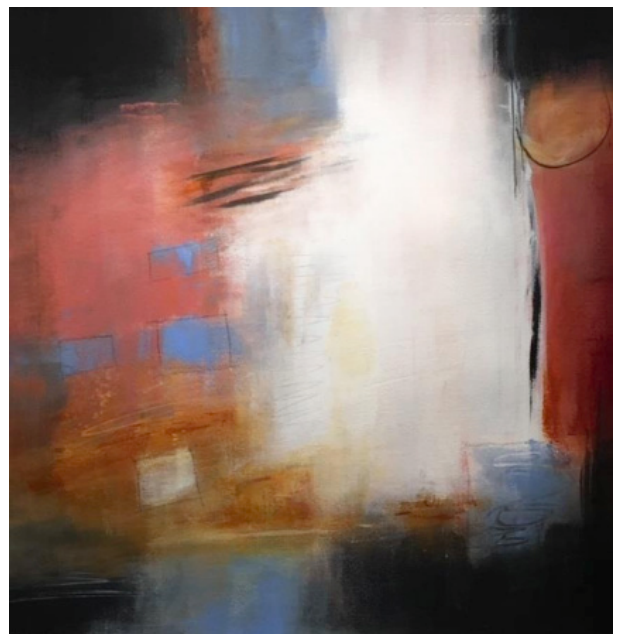

Judy LaFratta

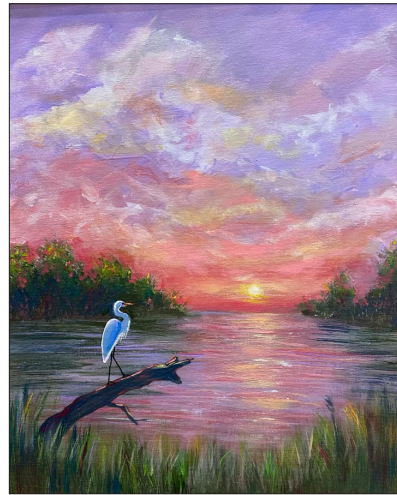

A multi lesson class that helps develop the children's collaboration, fine motor skills, as well as build self esteem, confidence plus several math skills.

This is one of many lessons the youth art group from Heritage Park and Hazel Hill receive each month, which covers a wide range of art applications from painting to mixed media. FCCA's Art Outreach also sponsors art classes to seniors at both HUD housing units in the city of Fredericksburg. It is solely funded by grants, monetary donations, as well as donated supplies like crayons!

The Montessori Class at The Alexander School of Early Learning came to The Silversmith House in February. FCCA members shared some of the history of the house, built in 1785, and how it became an art gallery in 1963, and is the oldest art gallery in Fredericksburg.

The exhibit in the Frederick Gallery featured the All Photography show. Thankfully Katharyn Poplin had heard of this event and came with a friend and her children to join the experience. Poplin is a fine photographer. She was kind enough to share about her camera and the art of capturing images. The students listened so well before taking a slow walk through three rooms of wonderful photography exhibit.

The four- and five-year-olds now had a challenge of getting downstairs safely while seeing and feeling the old walls that were made so long ago.

In the Members' Gallery they discovered very large and colorful paintings of African animals in the show Safari. We adults enjoyed watching their excited reactions.
